Dear Chairwoman Granger and Ranking Member DeLauro:

I am requesting funding for a large-scale mangrove restoration and rehabilitation project in the Jobos Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve in Puerto Rico in Fiscal Year 2024. The entity to receive funding for this project is The Ocean Foundation, located at 1320 19th Street, NW, Suite 500, Washington, D.C. 20036.

The funding would be used to conduct and expand a large-scale mangrove restoration and rehabilitation (R/R) project in the Jobos Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve, the second largest estuary in Puerto Rico and part of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Estuarine Research Reserve System. It will include both hydrological restoration and up to 724 acres of mangrove reforestation using the SAFE-Site method, which entails the creation of mangrove "dispersion centers" that enhance natural regeneration. This project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will help repair lingering damaged caused to Jobos Bay's mangrove forest structure by the 2017 hurricanes, which will in turn significantly contribute to hurricane-wind and flood protection for the surrounding communities and the critical power-generating assets that directly border the estuary.

The project has a Federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized in the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (16 U.S.C. § 1451 et seq.).
