I am requesting funding for police patrol vehicles, a security camera system, and equipment for the Añasco Municipal Police in Fiscal Year 2024. The entity to receive funding for this project is the Municipality of Añasco, located at P.O. Box 1385, Añasco, Puerto Rico 00610.

The funding would be used for the acquisition of the following equipment for the Municipality of Añasco's police department: four (4) police patrol vehicles; a system of twenty (20) security cameras, including its network equipment and solar-powered equipment; fifty (50) traffic safety barricades; one (1) computer and its printer; one-hundred (100) bullets; eight (8) handcuffs; sixteen (16) expandable batons; and eight (8) bulletproof vests.
